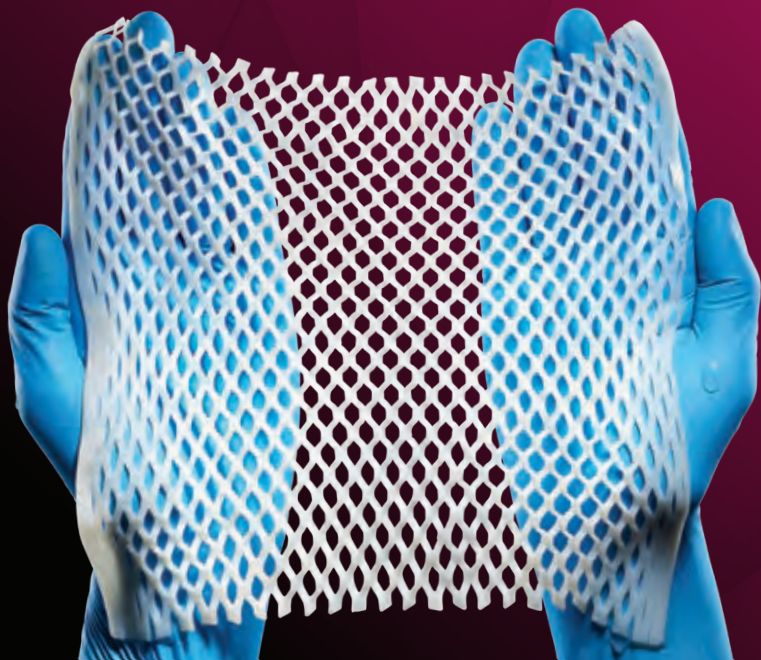
The International Center

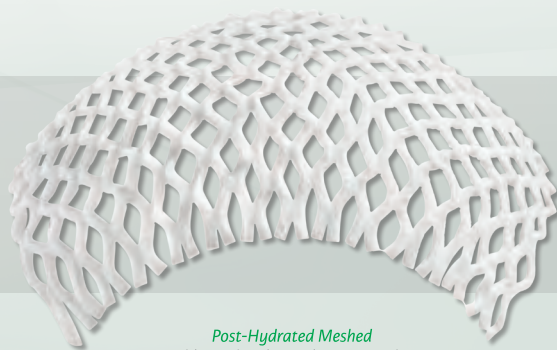

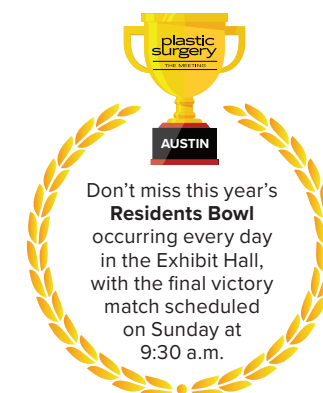

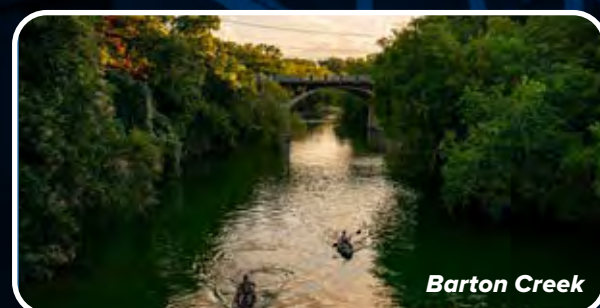
